Participant Statement:

Dear tribunal member, this statement is submitted on behalf of the Junction Residents Association comprised of 8 directors and 50 members who reside within the geograpaphic area described generally between Jane St (to the west), Keele Street (to the east), Annette Street (to the south), and the railway corridor (to the north between Dundas and St Clair Avenue). The association was formed in November 2020.

Our interest in this hearing stems from concerns about the precedent setting nature of development in the absence of local policies beyond existing provisions in the Official Plan and midrise guidelines that impact applications along the 'avenues' which Dundas Street is designated as.

While we recognize that the official plan sets the aspirational framework for development across the City, the Zoning By-laws are being crafted to implement policies into site specific standards without a local 'lense' to assess them. The City's zoning by-laws are a 'work in progress' and revised haphazardly in response to development pressures led by individual application proposals such as this one.

This proposal embodies the challenges our association faces in failing to identify and address key areas of concern; an acceptable transition in scale to surrounding properties; height and setbacks that are consistent with a local vision for Dundas; design guidelines that reflect the local building typology; servicing preferences that have repercussions for the evolution of laneways amidst their increasing use as an amenity and primary access for housing; and finally, the opportunity that has been missed by municipal planning officials to appreciate its context, and target the 'Junction' for a study to clarify local aspirations for change which is inevitable and the source of much consternation despite Official Plan policies to maintain growth and stability in our neighbourhoods and communities.
